Be Prepared

“Our nation’s educational institutions are entrusted to provide a safe and healthy learning environment for students, faculty, and staff. Faced with emergencies ranging from *active shooter* situations to fires, tornadoes, floods, hurricanes, earthquakes, and pandemic influenza, this is no easy task. Many of these emergencies occur with little to no warning; therefore, it is critical for educational institutions to plan ahead to help ensure the safety and general welfare of all members of the school and campus community” (rems.ed.gov).

The *Illinois School and Campus Safety Program* provides awareness and preparedness training to enhance organizational capacity to plan for, respond to, and recover from an emergency or disaster.
