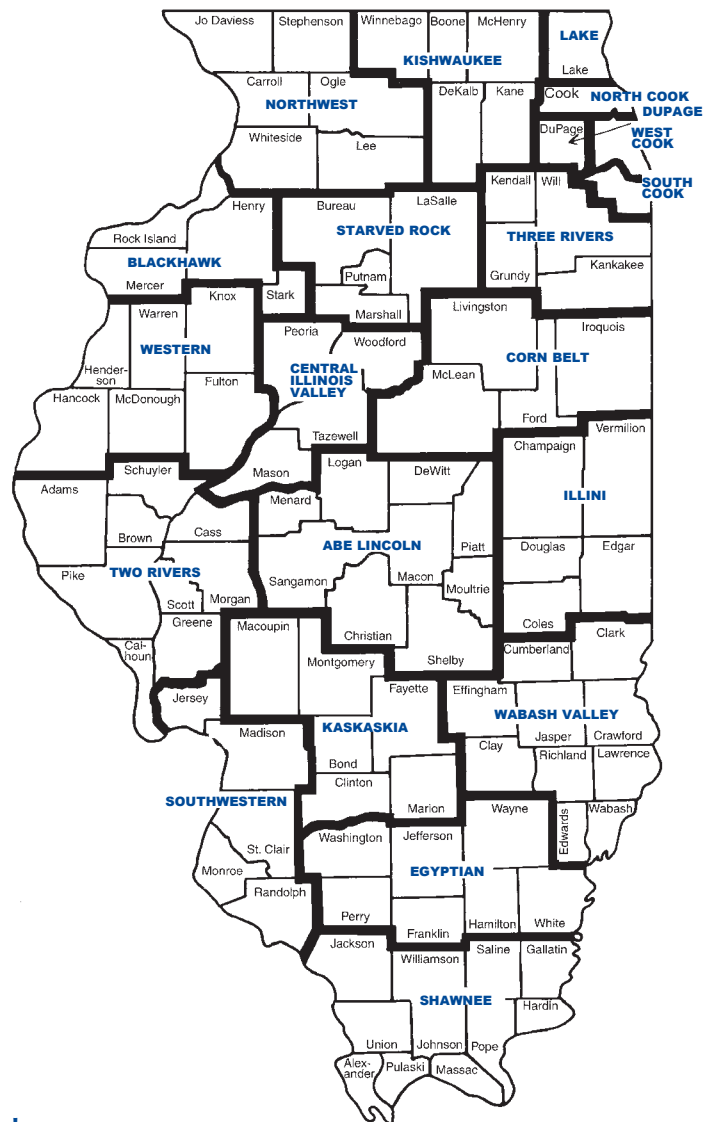

Governing the Illinois Association of School Boards

The Illinois Association of School Boards is a voluntary organization of local boards of education dedicated to strengthening the public schools through local citizen control. Although not a part of state government, IASB is organized by member school boards as a private not-for-profit corporation under authority granted by Article 23 of The Illinois School Code.

The Association was launched in December 1913, by a group of school board members at a meeting in Quincy, Illinois. Today, more than 98 percent of the school boards in Illinois hold active membership and support the Association through annual dues.

The Association's constitution provides that major policies be established by an annual Delegate Assembly and places governance in the hands of an elected board of directors. The board of directors, made up of officers and regional directors, employs an executive director and approves annual budgets to carry out the work of the Association.

The board, which meets five times per year, establishes policies governing the Association and setting standards for its management and operations. Governance policies of the board establish ends for the Association, including a statement of its mission, define the limits on executive authority of the staff, set forth board procedures, and describe the board-staff relationship. Taken together, these governance policies provide clear direction for the staff organization.
